Time allocation: Prevention and BLS vs team work practice

Practice discrepancies (Role of nurses, therapists, technicians, health care policy)

Use of laryngoscope and use of flow-inflating bag

Physics of suction pressure applied

Humidity of artificial airways rather than natural airways

Adequate depth of compression, ABC rather than CAB in children

Importance on pulse oximeters

Adenosine/amiodarone, epinephrine, Pediatric AED below school age (< 8Y)

Anaphylaxis/asthma, seizures, volvulus, myocarditis, febrile convulsion, choaking

Safe sedation management, adoption of high performance simulator

American Heart Association ⇒ International Heart/Lung/Brain and Children

CPR performance ⇒ More emphasis on Prevention
